# How did this process start?

### Why did SRLAAW undertake this process?

- Increased service demands without sufficient increases in resources
- Aging of Chapter 43
- Economic environment in Wisconsin and other states
- Desire for library community to make its own future

## How was the process designed?

- SRLAAW discussion
- WiLS proposal
- Subcommittee of volunteers

### Intended outcome from the process

"Recommendations and action steps to address concerns about and barriers to system reconfigurations, as well as addressing how systems remain effective in meeting the member library needs into the future"

### **Stated Values**

- Transparency
- Inclusiveness
- Dialogue

## Steps / Timeline

- Identify specific services and other areas of concern to be addressed through the process
- Survey Wisconsin libraries about the identified areas (January 2013)
- Hold 2-3 webinars with states that have undergone system consolidation (January 2013)
- Hold a SRLAAW retreat (February 2013)
- Prepare a list of recommendations and action steps based on survey and retreat results (March 2013 – May 2013)

# Identify specific services and other areas of concern to be addressed through the process

- Awareness of library system and library services
- Funding
- Library law
- Resource sharing
- Service implications of technology
- Technology infrastructure

#### Survey Wisconsin libraries about the identified areas

- 6 surveys one for each area
- 152 197 responses received for each survey
- Report and raw data posted on SRLAAW process webpage

# Hold 2-3 webinars with states that have undergone system consolidation


- 2 webinars held: Massachusetts and Illinois
- 3 additional states contacted: California, Iowa, Ohio
- Report and webinar archives on SRLAAW process webpage

#### Hold a SRLAAW retreat

- 3 representatives per system (system, resource library, other)
- Focused around the six content areas
- Large/small group discussions
  - best practices
  - o long term and short term future
- All the information from the retreat is available on the process webpage

# Prepare a list of recommendations and action steps based on survey and retreat results

- Subcommittee worked from February through April to draft report
- Considered all of the input collected from surveys and retreat
- Focus evolved from best practices to recommendations and standards
- Discussion focused on service to library patrons throughout the state
- Progress Report and Preliminary Recommendations released May 1st



### Feedback mechanisms

- Focus group sessions
- Individual interviews
- Online feedback form
- Email to committee (SRLAAWfeedback@wils.org)
- Contact committee members

## Steps / Timeline

- Collect feedback on the recommendations from the library community and others. (May July 2013)
- Revise recommendations and action steps based on feedback received. (July 2013)
- Present recommendations to SRLAAW for endorsement. (August 2013)
- Ask appropriate parties to work on implementing recommendations.
  (August 2013)
- SRLAAW begins taking recommended action steps. (August 2013)
